

## Choosing Topics

- Students may submit at most two papers to seminar committees. Then the committees will recommend which one is more compatible to their skill set, however, students must make their own decision afterward.
- Students are allow to change their papers prior to a certain due date (See time table). After that, students cannot change their topics by any means.
- Students must turn in their papers (or changing their papers) to [nantapath@mathstat.sci.tu.ac.th](mailto:nantapath@mathstat.sci.tu.ac.th) and [borwornk@mathstat.sci.tu.ac.th](mailto:borwornk@mathstat.sci.tu.ac.th) before a certain due date (See time table).

## Basic Regulations

- In each talk, every student must submit their own presentation materials at least one week before that talk to [nantapath@mathstat.sci.tu.ac.th](mailto:nantapath@mathstat.sci.tu.ac.th) and [borwornk@mathstat.sci.tu.ac.th](mailto:borwornk@mathstat.sci.tu.ac.th). It could be presentation slides or an outline with a good amount of details.
- This seminar consists of 2 talks: first and final talks. On each talk, each student gives a forty five-minute presentation and has thirty minutes to answer the questions.
- In each talk, there is a group of committees, one of them must be student's advisor and the rest are invited committees who has strong expertise in student's topic. Each student will have the same group of committees throughout the whole 2 talks.
- Students must attend every talks. Any students who miss a talk will get N in this course.
- Each student should ask speakers at least a question per talk.

## Grades and Scores

- Students who get at least 70 points will get the grade P (Pass); otherwise, N (Not Pass).
- Scores will be distributed as follows:
